There are 333,828,917 people in the USA as of December 17, 2021. Of that 2 PERCENT are homeless so 6,676,578 PEOPLE in the United States.

30 % of all homeless people are women or 2,002,973, and 70% of the homes people are men or 4,673,605.

A survey found that 23 percent of all homeless women 2,002,973 or **460,684 are female veterans.**

33 percent of all homeless men 4,673,605 or **1,542,290** are male veterans. Combined there are 2,002,974 HOMLESS VETERANS today.

Additionally, there are about 38,000 **veterans** nationwide are without stable housing, these statistics are most likely low, since there is no current information on how veterans as a whole have fared since many people have lost their jobs due to the unnecessary shout downs of many industries due to Covid. There has been an increase of **homelessness** of 2.2 percent from 2019 to 2020. Figures are not in yet for 2021 with the Covid situation.

WHY VETERANS ARE HOMELESS:

In addition to the complex set of factors that affect most homeless individuals the lack of affordable housing, poverty, job or income loss, mental illness, substance abuse, health problems, etc. many veterans live with the lingering effect of PTSD, often compounded by a lack of family and social support networks. Military occupations and training are not always transferable to the civilian workforce, placing some veterans at a disadvantage when competing for employment.

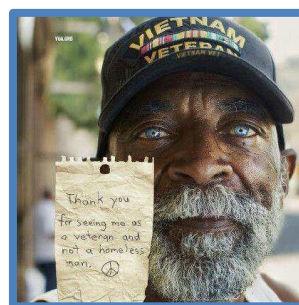
WHO ARE HOMELESS VETERANS?

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) states the nation's homeless veterans are predominantly male, with roughly 30 percent being female. The majority of them are single; come from urban areas; and suffer from PTSD, mental illness, alcohol and/or substance abuse, or co-occurring disorders. About one-third of the adult homeless population are veterans.

America's homeless veterans have served in World War II, the Korean War, Cold War, Vietnam War, Grenada, Panama, Lebanon, Afghanistan, and Iraq (OEF/OIF), the military's anti-drug cultivation efforts in South America, and elsewhere. Nearly half of homeless veterans served during the Vietnam era. Two-thirds served our country for at least three years, and one-third were stationed in a war zone.

HOMELESS AFRICAN AMERICAN VETERANS

Roughly 56 percent of all homeless veterans are African American or Hispanic, despite only accounting for 12.8 percent and 15.4 percent of the U.S. population, respectively. About 1.5 million other veterans, meanwhile, are considered at risk of homelessness due to poverty, lack of support networks, and dismal living conditions in overcrowded or substandard housing.



HOMELESS FEMALE VETERANS

When you think of homeless veterans, you may not immediately think of female vets. But the Department of Veterans Affairs says that women comprise the fastest-growing segment of the homeless veteran population.

In its 2017 Annual Homeless Assessment Report to Congress, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) estimated that just over 40,000 veterans were homeless on a single night in January of that year. Of those, about 9% were women. From 2016 to 2017, the number of homeless female veterans increased by 7%, compared with 1% for their male counterparts.



In a 2016 report, the VA-funded National Center on Homelessness Among Veterans said the number of women identified by the program as homeless, or who accessed VA programs to end homelessness, tripled to 36,443 in a five-year period ending in 2015. That figure, according to the center, is projected to rise by about 9% to nearly 40,000 by 2025.

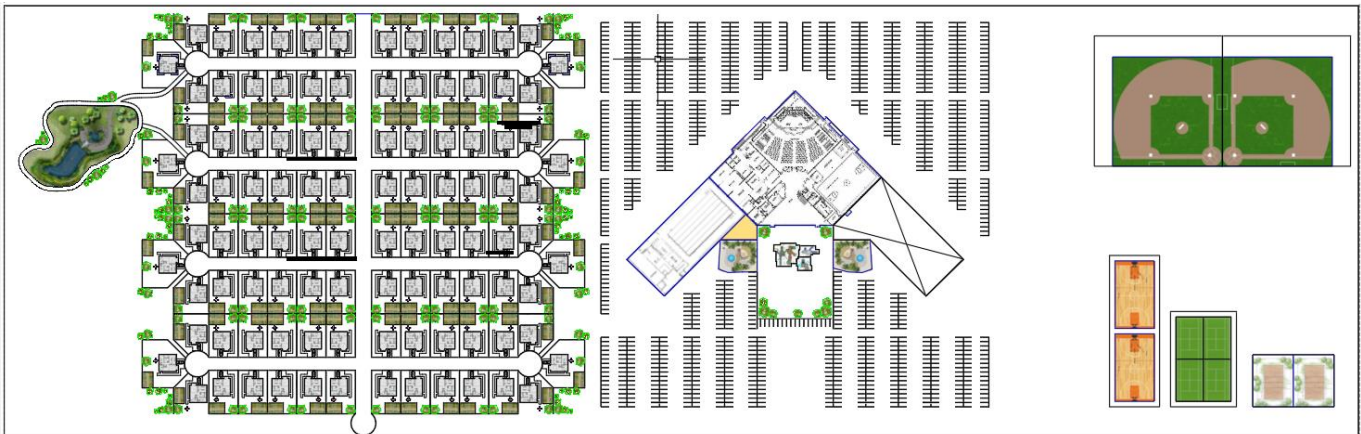
DOES THE VA TAKE CARE OF HOMELESS VETERANS?

To a certain extent, yes. The VA's specialized homeless programs served more than 92,000 veterans in 2009, (No statistics since 2009) which is highly commendable. This still leaves well over hundreds of thousands more veterans, however, who must seek assistance from local government agencies and community- and faith-based service organizations.

The VA's programs for homeless veterans have emphasized collaboration with such community service providers to help expand services to more veterans in crisis. These partnerships are credited with reducing the number of homeless veterans. They take on more than half the veterans in need. The Veterans administration has gone completely online for applications, this in itself has made it more difficult. The SBA has taken over the website dealing with applying for services, and this is a difficult at best system to try and work. Most veterans attempting to apply become frustrated and many do not have access to computers where they can upload documents. Also most homeless veterans do not have bank accounts for their wages to be placed in, since they have no permanent address to list, making receiving benefits even more difficult.

SERVICES THE VETERANS WILL NEED:

Veterans need a coordinated effort that provides secure housing, nutritional meals, basic physical health care, substance abuse care and aftercare, mental health counseling, personal development, and empowerment. Additionally, veterans need job assessment, training, and placement assistance.

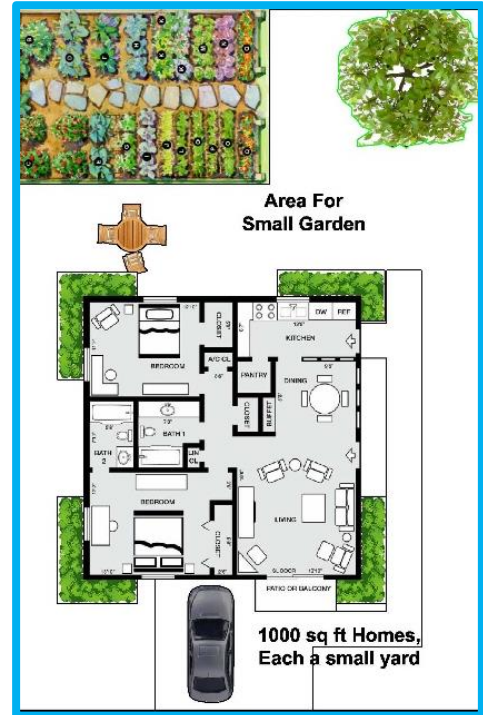


MY PROJECT GOALS:

My goal will be to utilize the Funds received from the RV Bonds and Currency to create a Veteran's Village for disabled or homeless Veterans. We will work with the local Veteran services, Veterans of Foreign Wars, and the VA to identify who can utilize this service in any local area along with many church groups who can also help to identify veterans in need.

We will utilize where possible, veteran owned businesses for engineering, design and construction while building the village. Homes will be secure, in a reasonably quiet location, a place to call their own. Once we purchase the property approximately 10 to 100 acres this site will do the following:

- Creates Jobs – utilizing veterans wherever possible.
- Support Homeless / Disabled Veterans and Spouses in the local Community
- The goal of this mission is to serve, rehabilitate and provide a comfortable, functional home community for homeless and disabled veterans and their spouses.
- Create an exclusive community of detached, single-family homes in quiet area
- Build modern housing with disability enhancements
- provide counseling and rehabilitation through use of med beds, clinical staff and socialization
- Offer legal services for recovery of veteran’s benefits if needed
- Promote socialization and physical activities within on - site activity center, complete with exercise pool, fitness area, common area and more
- provide transportation to / from medical appointments
- maintain grounds and facilities,
- Houses will be approximately 1,000 SQ FT. This is big enough for them to have room but not so big that the care would become overwhelming for someone who has been homeless for a while. Homes will be ADA compliant. They will come in 1 bedroom, 2 bedroom & 3 bedroom based on family size.
- We will also provide the basic furniture needed for a home.
- We will provide classes on home maintenance although most veterans already know how to maintain a house any need will be determined through the process.
- Most veterans if provided a home like this could use their military benefits for food and clothing and get a fresh start.
- Those who do not have military retirement or disability funds we will assist in helping them file for their disabilities paperwork or assist them with finding work or helping them get trained to help provide for themselves.
- Each home will have a private back yard and an area



for a private garden if they choose. We will either provide yard equipment that can be used or assist with yard maintenance where required.

We will have the following jobs created for the facilities and where possible will chose from the many veterans for these positions

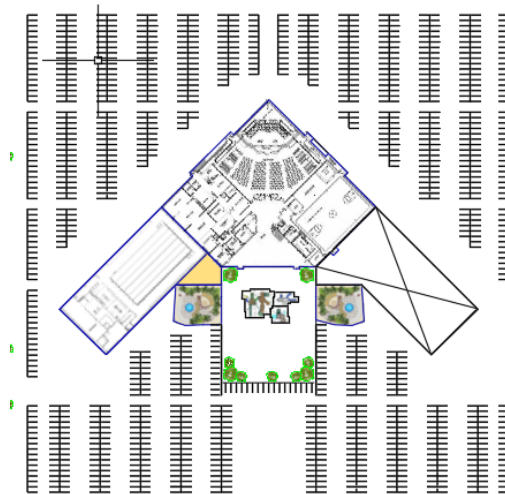
- Nurses- 2

- Facilities- 6
- Counselor- 1
- Activities group- 4
- Grounds Keeper – 1
- CPA – 1
- Project / Construction Manager during construction phase.
- Part time attorney (as needed)

THE COMMUNITY WILL HAVE THE FOLLOWING FOR THE WHOLE TOWN TO USE:

- Community center / local non-denominational Christian Church
- Outdoor and Indoor swimming pool
- Basketball Court Indoor & Outdoor
- Gymnasium to be used to help Homeless when weather is bad
- Large Community Kitchen to Serve Weekly Meals
- Running Track, Walking Track, Indoor & Outdoor
- Area where dance lesson, archery lessons, many other communities get together can Happen.
- Safe and Secure Voting Places.
- Indoor and Outdoor Play Areas for Kids.
- A Community underground storm Shelter in the Basement that is rated for the local area.
 1. There will be sports areas based on the local population, Baseball, Basketball, Tennis, Soccer, A place for family fun and outdoor activities can come together to promote Physical acidity.
 2. Food Pantry,
 3. Cloths Pantry
 4. Children’s Pantry
 5. School Supplies for those who cannot afford it.
 6. Secure Sleeping accommodations for those in need (Women’s and Children’s SAFE House).
 7. Emotional Needs Counseling area.
 8. Business and Computer center set up to help print Resumes, look for work secure from inappropriate Sites.
 9. Approximately 104 Homes, 2 and 3-Bedroom homes, with a few 4 Bedroom Homes, in the plans.

12. Homeless Priority Next
13. Homes ADA Compliant
Access to the Local Community Center for assistance,
15. Lending Closets for maintenance equipment,
16. Classes for learning how to do Maintenance on house,

18. Community Center Can be renter by the local community and become self-sustaining, to pay for the employees,
19. it will become a major part of small communities providing safe places for people and provide smaller communities much needed facilities.
20. There will be a separation between the homes and community center for safety and privacy.
21. There will be after school areas for Latchkey Kids and activities to keep them busy.

The church area will be used for public meetings, and community events. Being privately owned it will be used for many events and not affect the community's budget.



BUILDING CONSTRUCTION:

I wish to use either 3D printing machines, or Insulated Concrete forms for this process or something quick fast structurally sound, Weather Resistant, Energy Saving and Eco products like:

LUMBER COSTS:

The surge in demand and dearth of supply in lumber are causing all sorts of volatility and distortions in the market. The lumber futures market keeps hitting new highs, surpassing \$1,400 per 1,000 board feet.

By switching to 3D printing for the Military housing we hope to provide the following:

- Save Money – providing our funds to go further thus helping mover veterans get housing. Stronger – These homes will be as strong if not stronger than conventionally built stick housing and designed to withstand weather in most locations of the country.
- Faster – the ability to get housing up quicker, with in local building codes means less Homeless people on the streets.
- Versatility – Homes can be made in multiple sizes and shapes styles and not be limited by dimensional concerns.
- Speed in construction – these systems allow to get the houses up quickly where often weather conditions put countless delays in the building process.
- Less wasted materials – cleanup is easier on the sites less product sent to landfills, and easier on the budget.
- Labor – Although this saves in labor costs, it often means some of the more expensive trades can be replaced with local help, bringing jobs to a greater variety of people and help to train them in new skills.



OUR GOAL:

Is to create our own manufacturing plant for a product like this providing not only engineering, design and cost saving but provide low-cost housing for the homeless, in safe communities, starting with Veterans and shortly after this helping the homeless and infirmed.

ACCESS OF THE TECH

Regenerative Technology has been around for 80 years in the secret space program
If released it would reduce health care cost from 20% GDP to almost nothing. This means more money in your pocket and a boom to the world economy.

IMPLEMENTATION

According to Randy Cramer, military is agreeing to release the technology but not willing to fund it because it's considered classified military technology and would require paperwork which may end up burying the technology or severely delay its implementation if military attempted to release it.

Must require public sector investor. Problem is potential civilian funders want too much control and ownership over the technology. There is concern they would limit access due to greed and selfishness. Once funding flows it could take about 10 years before it becomes widely in use.

Will probably require creation of private clinics as there is much resistance by the entrenched medical establishment and hospitals due the risk of damaging their current business models.

Demand could soon become so astronomical , hospitals will be forced to upgrade otherwise they will become obsolete or out of business.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: According to Rand, there are three (3) types of Med Beds: (1) Holographic Med Beds; (2) Regenerative Med Beds which regenerates tissue and body parts, that's powered by a different source; (3) Re-atomization Med Beds that in about two-and-half to three minutes will regenerate the whole human body, head to toe. I would like to create Med

Bed Facilities for use by Veterans, Active-Duty Military and Homeless Vets, and also open the facility to those in areas where getting to a facility would be difficult and making a mobile unit to go to those areas.

LOCATION: I would place these facilities near Veteran's facilities. This would be run in conjunction with doctors but not through either a hospital or the VA. Currently hospitals are bogged down with bean counters who spend more time worrying about the money coming in than taking care of patients. In order to get an appointment for anything, so that insurance pays for it, you first have to make an appointment with your general practitioner, he then will order more tests, possibly weeks away, and it could be six months before you get an appointment if at all.



The general practitioners try and fill you with drugs since many get kickbacks from the drug companies and they are still busy paying off their student loans. It is unrealistic to think that any med beds that make it to a hospital will be used for those who desperately need them. Let's face it those with a lot of money will simply bribe a clerk to give them access and those who need these the most won't have access. (Note see article above, expressing the same concerns.

HOW DOES IT WORK:

Technology hidden away from humanity for years, these pod-like beds are predicted to have healing capabilities for a wide range of diseases. Depending on the bed, typically the bed scans your body much like an MRI, based on the readings it receives through AI (Artificial

Intelligence), the computer determines what is going on inside your body and provides a diagnosis, based upon the diagnoses the technology proceeds to heal you. For healing at the baseline level ensure your cells are performing optimally.

Many Military Veterans who are injured either physically or mentally or emotionally need help, many will not go to the VA because it has had an issue with poor quality people, poor quality equipment and lack of empathy from those underpaid people working there. As a veteran who is married to a 100% disabled from a military career, I know what it is like and so many are in greater need than us. We want to give back to our Military Heroes and not charge them. We

would start out in our local area and create a method working with licensed Doctors locally setting up a standard of care for healing.

Again, to help give them their lives back. We would provide Med bed locations for those who are not financially able to afford health insurance Starting out in Rural and low-income areas. When I get the funds from the RV I want to purchase as many Med Beds as I can, or alternately take the Patents and make the beds creating work opportunity in areas that need the jobs. These med beds would be put in areas where people in financial difficulty could utilize them. One of my concerns is the med beds that are being distributed will be manipulated by the wealthy for removing wrinkles and the poor or the mentally disabled, physically disabled will not get access to them, or certainly would probably not be welcomed openly in areas or large hospitals.

My goal would be to get several med beds of each type in the facilities. The facilities would be run by doctors, but none associated to hospitals, and they cannot accept gifts from drug companies. I would use natural paths, and other doctors that have open minds and a true desire to help heal those needing

healing. For each location we start providing needed Med Beds to the Military and those with no financial means to get access to this equipment as a priority. Those who are able to pay will pay based on their financial circumstances.

With the release of the RV funds, I will hire a design team who will set up the optimum number of units to fit into locally already available buildings. We will set up procedures and capabilities and create a standard so that others can easily take our information and start their own facilities, somewhat like a franchise does but without the franchise fees.

FACILITIES: My goal is to purchase used buildings and have them renovated. I have access to many engineering firms that can professionally design a building for proper use. I also want to fit up some large coaches with med beds so that we can take this technology to those areas where homeless veterans are.
